Finally, our usual offering of reviews of new books of poetry and Whitman scholarship is this year buttressed by seven review essays by members of the first Whitman seminar at the Walt Whitman Library, given in 1986 under the auspices of the Graduate School at Rutgers University in Camden, instructed by Professor Betsy Erkkila of the University of Pennsylvania, and supported by a grant from the New Jersey Department of Higher Education. The DHE also funded the cataloging of the Whitman Library collection, which will be published as a special issue of *The Mickle Street Review* in the near future.
